

CHRISTMAS WEEK IN ST MARY MAGDALENE





I want to acknowledge and pass on the thanks of South Belfast Foodbank to you for your recent food donation equalling 233kgs to our vital work. This will provide approximately 555 meals to those struggling in our community. We really appreciate your generosity!

This donation will help us to continue supporting the people of South Belfast during these difficult times for our nation.

Last year there were 2,218 vouchers/ E-referrals issued by our agencies. This resulted in 4,959 people fed, of that, 3,065 were adults, and 1,894 were children.

Behind each number is a person living in food poverty. This is not right and should not be the case. As a foodbank, we want to see more people helped out of crisis and fewer people needing foodbanks in the future. But until this happens we rely on the generosity of the people in South Belfast and people like you.

GIFT DAY ENVELOPE

Our annual Gift Day, marking the 182nd anniversary of our church (1st December 1839) will be celebrated on Sunday 4th December,

As the congregation and membership of St Mary Magdalene reduces each year, the Select Vestry becomes more and more concerned about the state of our property. During the last few months the kitchen and ladies' toilets have been flooded a number of times due to the ingress of water from the chimney stack at the side of the church hall. The rendering on the stack is falling off and the brick is separating from the wall of the hall. The repairs will cost in the region of £10,000. Where will this money come from? Most people would say that we should be applying for grants - we have done this but so far have not been successful. To be successful for some grants, we have to be able to cover at least half of the cost which, at present, we cannot. Next year our buildings will cost in the region of £25,000 to restore and redecorate. We have just spent almost $\pounds 6,000$ on the ladies' toilets and $\pounds 4,000$ on buildings insurance leaving very little in the Restoration account to cover any other maintenance. St Mary Magdalene is an old church and needs to be taken care of. Will you help by giving whatever you can to help us keep the church alive and in good order? Our new Minister-in-Charge, Archdeacon Barry Forde has been an inspiration and is encouraging us to look to the future. With your help St. Mary Magdalene Parish Church will still be standing in Donegall Pass for years to come.

PS If anyone can help with grant applications we would be very grateful.
